Camp HYPE Healthcare sponspored by Ascension Via Christi was held at the Urban League of Wichita. The students got to have hands-on experience with pig lungs and the Respiratory Therapy Team. They were also visited by former WSU basketball player and current Ascension Via Christi Project Manager and Sports Medicine leader Ron Baker, who detailed his career journey into the medical field. Students were able to connect their interests with local education options with tours from WSU Tech South.















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Camp HYPE Textron Aviation participants each completed a sheet metal practice sheet, totaling 690 Rivets! They also made 23 airplane phone holders while onsite at Textron Aviation. Students got to observe multiple processes that are required to build an aircraft and maintaining customers' planes during tours. Thanks to WSU Tech Students were able to see what the aircraft looks like and explored options for post-secondary education. The Future Makers lab provided hands-on activities for the students including virtual welding, drone flight simulations, Augmented Reality, and CAD.



















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Camp HYPE Spirit AeroSystems started off singing with a Grammy-nominated STEM singer, Roy Moye, and students got first-hand experience in engineering with Jennifer Marshall and packaging prototypes with Pam Roberts. Students learn that 12 paper circles, when engineered correctly, can hold the weight of 10 college books; 24 paper circles can hold a student! During this camp, 264 paper circles were made, 14 s'mores packages were tested, and 23 s'mores were eaten at the end of camp!































Camp HYPE Technology sponsored by Flagship Kansas was held at Groover Labs, a hub for local prototype makers and Technology companies! Students got to meet Miss Meadow Lark, founder of Let's Go Full Steam A Head, Sierra Bonn, and NXTUS Program Manager Amber Dunn. Students tried to solve 19 pet peeve problems with Sierra, wrote elevator pitches and picked walk-up songs. Novacoast provided the students with a tour of their headquarters in the Epic Center where students learned about Cyber Security, and the qualities Novacoast looks for when hiring interns. Much to the excitement of the students they got to see what the view looked like from the tallest building in Kansas. Integra Technology also provided a tour with a hands-on circuit activity where students utilized 38 9-volt batteries, 19 Bridge/Ground pieces, 19 capacitors, 19 LED lights, 38 connecting cables.





















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Camp HYPE Financial Services sponsored by Bank of America and Meritrust Credit Union was attended by 23 students. The week included 4 tours, and 4 panel discussions with 25 business professionals! During the camp, AGH CPA's & Advisors provided 23 interview tip sheets with 10 pointers for interviews as well as a tour of their office in the Epic Center. The students toured Forvis at the Waterfront where they got an inside look at Financial Services and heard from a panel of Forvis managers. Bank of America held an afternoon discussion with several leaders from various departments, and many students showed off soft skills they had learned during camp while discussing the importance of those skills. 6 students expressed interest in interning with Bank of America. Meritrust Credit Union closed out the week with a detailed overview of services and a resource fair with 8 leaders of various departments. The students received a Meritrust Meet and Greet time sheet to help them be successful during that time, which included 12 questions for students to ask the leaders totaling out to 276 questions!













## Camp HYPE Public Safety 2023

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Camp HYPE Public Safety was sponsored by the Wichita Metro Crime Commission and was attended by 20 paricipants. During this camp, there were engagements with 18 law enforcement officers, 16 human and two K-9 officers, one all-day interactive visit to the Sedgwick County Courthouse and Detention Facility, a resource fair, and a college tour. Students got to meet with a deputy and their K-9 officer and learn about the forensic science institute with a virtual tour hosted by Dr. Steadman. During the all-day experience at the Sedgwick County Courthouse and Detention Facility, students got to meet and talk with 2 judges, 3 attorneys, and 1 officer. Students were provided lunch at the Detention Facility before the tour, where they were able to see the inside of a ward. The final activity of the day took place in a courtroom where the students witnessed closing statements of a trial. On the final day of camp, students had a department overview with the Kansas Department of Children and Families (DCF) to learn about services and careers within DCF, the students had many opportunities to get prizes during the presentations!
