

The goal of the Workforce Alliance Local Workforce Development Board (LWDB) serving Kansas Local Area IV is to leverage resources and align services to increase the community impact of the annual Federal allocation from the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). At the direction of the LWDB, staff and Workforce Center partners seek opportunities to secure grants and collaborate on training projects to bring more funding to the region. The result is job seekers in Local Area IV have access to a variety of different employment and training programs.

This report summarizes the number of people currently being funding for education and skills training, the occupation and employment sectors of the training, the education providers and leveraged funds. The WA releases a Training Report twice per year, in the Spring and Fall.


For Program Year 2021, 42 percent of the budget is from the annual WIOA allocation, and the balance comes from other grants and special projects. Here are the projects and programs that are currently funding skills training in Local Area IV.

#### Key findings in the Fall 2021 report include:

- Currently 830 are enrolled in training, an increase of 79 since the last report
- There were 147 participants that completed training since the last report
- The employment sector with most active training participants is Advanced Manufacturing/Aerospace with 254. (273 in the last report)
- The number of participants in the Data and IT sector increased to 45 (27 in the last report)
- Enrollment in Registered Apprenticeship programs was 245. (198 in the last report)
- It is anticipated 392 individuals will complete education and skills training by the end of 2022

#### <u>Success Story – Healthcare Career Pathway</u>


Pamela came to the Wichita Workforce Center in July 2020 after she was laid off from for a job earing \$13.00 per hour. She had previous experience in the Retail and Manufacturing industry and served in the United States Military. Through the WIOA Adult program she chose the Medical Assistant Career Pathway to earn several stackable credentials giving her multiple employment options. She achieved the following credentials: CNA recertification / updated license, Phlebotomy Certification, EKG Certification and National License and Medical Assistant Certification.

After completing training in May, Pamela was able to gain full-time employment in August at Diversicare of Sedgwick, working as a Traveling CNA/CMA with at starting wage of \$23.00 per hour, with benefits. Pamela indicated that this was the highest wage she has made to date and was very proud of herself for continuing to stay motivated to complete all of her credentials providing a career opportunity in the healthcare industry.

#### Success Story – Upskilling After Lay-Off

Maria came to the Wichita Workforce Center in August 2020 with a projected layoff date in less than 30 days from her current employer in the Aviation Industry. She wanted to stay in Aviation but did not have academic or industry recognized credentials to provide opportunities for self-sufficient and stable employment to support her family of three. Through the Partner4Work and National Dislocated Worker Grant programs, Maria earned a CNC Operator Technical Certificate in May of 2021. In less than two weeks, Maria was hired at Textron Aviation as a Composites Bond Technician. This is full-time employment, making \$20.17 per hour plus benefits, nearly \$3.00 more than she was making from her previous employer.


