- The total attendance number so far of students is 157 for 2023 compared to 93 students, at 68% increase!
- Total wages paid to youth so far: \$31,400 (\$200 per student)

- Camp HYPE Trade Skills built 23 toolboxes, 23 light-up circuits and several students took welding pieces home with them.
- Camp HYPE Textron completed 23 sheet metal practice sheets which totaled out to 690 Rivets!
 They also made 23 airplane phone holders.
